

1 The board is committed to providing educational opportunities for the school-age students residing
2 within its boundaries. Taking into account the legislative intent and language of the dual enrollment
3 statute, this board adopts the following policy.

4
5 **DEFINITIONS**

6
7 Dual Enrollment: A dually enrolled student residing within the boundaries of this district who is
8 legitimately enrolled in a private, parochial, or home school, charter school or other alternative
9 public school program, or at a post secondary institution, and who is also dual enrolled in a
10 traditional public school in this district and has not graduated from high school.

11
12 Dually enrolled Student: A student who receives educational instruction outside a traditional public
13 school classroom. Such instruction can include, but is not limited to, a private, parochial, or home
14 school, charter school or other alternative public school program, or a post-secondary institution.

15
16 Primary Education Provider: The person or entity providing the dually enrolled student’s educational
17 instruction outside the traditional public school programs or activities, such as the private, parochial,
18 or home school or other alternative public school program, charter school or post secondary
19 institution.

20
21 Program and Activity: The terms “program” and “activity” include any program in the traditional
22 public school available to other students. This includes any regularly scheduled course of study or
23 any regularly scheduled interscholastic activity recognized or sanctioned by the Idaho High School
24 Activities Association.

25
26 **ENROLLMENT**

27
28 A dually enrolled student wishing to enroll in this school district for academic and/or extracurricular
29 programs or activities must:

- 30
- 31 1. Provide the same documentation and information required of all other students enrolling in
32 the district, including evidence of residence in this district, acceptable evidence of date and
33 place of birth, evidence of immunizations required by the State of Idaho (or a suitable
34 waiver); and
35
 - 36 2. Comply with the registration procedures required by the district and gain admission to a
37 school in this district. In addition to routine procedures required for registration, a student’s
38 parent/guardian must provide a complete record of the student’s academic history, as well as
39 all other student records and testing information necessary to qualify for admission as a
40 dually enrolled student and to identify appropriate placement for the student. Such
41 registration and admission procedures are required even if a student is requesting dual
42 enrollment status only for participation in an interscholastic or nonacademic activity.
43

44 If enrollment in a specific class or program reaches the maximum for the program, priority for
45 enrollment will be given to a student who is enrolled full time in the traditional public school class

1 or program. If a class or program is full and includes a part-time dually enrolled student when a
2 regular full-time student transfers into the school during the semester, the district's normal
3 enrollment procedure will remain the same, and the dually enrolled student may not be disenrolled to
4 provide space for the full-time student. Regular full-time students will be given priority for
5 enrollment at the start of each semester.

6 7 **REGULATIONS AND POLICIES**

8
9 A dually enrolled school student who is participating in this district's programs and activities will be
10 given the same rights as all other students enrolled in this district. Dually enrolled school students
11 will also be subject to compliance with the same rules and requirements that apply to full-time
12 students.

13 14 **PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITIES**

15
16 This district's responsibility for any dually enrolled student extends only to the time that the student
17 is attending the program or activity for which the student is enrolled in the district's school. The
18 parent or guardian of the student is responsible for the care and supervision of the student during all
19 other times.

20 21 **MIXED CURRICULUM**

22
23 Dually enrolled students are welcome to participate in classes or grades with a merged or integrated
24 curriculum as long as space is available.

25
26 If a dually enrolled student wishes to attend activities or programs in a particular discipline in a class
27 or grade where the curriculum is merged or integrated, such request must be made in writing
28 particularizing the subject matter presentation that the student desires to attend (e.g., art instruction
29 in the third grade). The teacher and principal of the school will, upon request, provide scheduling
30 information to the dually enrolled student. It will be the dually enrolled student's responsibility to
31 contact the district and ascertain when such subject matter will be presented. Where certain subject
32 matter is integrated into a mixed curriculum, no change in the presentation need be made because of
33 a dually enrolled student's request for attendance. It is also the intent of this policy to ensure that the
34 teacher's right to integrate disciplines and be flexible in planning and modifying the daily classroom
35 presentations will not be hindered or restricted in any way.

36 37 **IDEA/SECTION 504/ADA STUDENTS**

38
39 A dually enrolled school student's parent/guardian who wishes to enroll the child in special
40 programs, or who desires special accommodations consistent with the child's disability, must meet
41 the requirements of the Individuals With Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Section 504 of the 1973
42 Rehabilitation Act, or the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

43 44 **GRADUATION**

45
46 Dually enrolled students must meet all graduation requirements of the state and this district in order

1 to graduate, to take part in the commencement ceremony, and to obtain a diploma from this district.
2 Dually enrolled students must be enrolled in a program approved by the school during their last
3 semester.

4 5 **TRANSPORTATION**

6
7 A dually enrolled student may ride a school bus on a regularly scheduled route so long as the student
8 is eligible for transportation and space is available. No alterations of routes or new bus stops will be
9 established. If a dually enrolled student attends part time, the student may receive transportation at
10 the regularly scheduled time closest to the time period for which the student is enrolled.

11 12 **INTERIM PERIODS**

13
14 If a dually enrolled student is dual enrolled in classes or activities that are not contiguous in time
15 (e.g., a first period and a fourth period class), the student must not be on the school premises other
16 than when the program or activity for which the student is enrolled is taking place. The district will
17 not be responsible for the care or supervision of the student in any form for periods before, in
18 between, or after the programs or activities for which the student is properly enrolled. Any
19 transportation needs for such students not provided for otherwise under this policy during the school
20 day will be the sole responsibility of the student and his or her parent/guardian.

21 22 **EXTRACURRICULAR NONACADEMIC ACTIVITIES**

23
24 A dually enrolled student involved in an extracurricular activity is subject to the same eligibility
25 standards and participation requirements as a regular full-time student.

26
27 Oversight of academic standards relating to participation in nonacademic public school activities is
28 the responsibility of the Primary Education Provider of each dually enrolled student.

29
30 A dually enrolled student must meet or exceed the testing requirements established by the State
31 Board of Education before the student may participate in nonacademic public school activities. The
32 Idaho High School Activities Association has chosen the ITBS or TAPS tests for this purpose. The
33 testing is at the parent's/guardian's expense, and the test results are valid for twelve (12) months
34 from the release date. The student must achieve a minimum composite score of the fifth stanine or
35 higher to be eligible for dual enrollment each year admission is requested in nonacademic programs.
